What is the Sports Premium?

The Government is providing funding for primary school PE and sport. In 2023/24 this is £16,000 per school plus £1.0 per pupil. The PE and sport premium funding can only be spent on this provision in schools.

Purpose of funding

Schools have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport in order to:

- Develop or add to the PE and sports activities that the school already offers
- Build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in later years

How will we be spending the Sports Funding and who will benefit?

- All children will benefit regardless of sporting ability and all children will be engaged in regular physical activity
- The profile of sport and healthy lifestyles will be increased for all.
- A broad range of sports will be offered to all children.
- All children will be given the opportunity to compete and participate in PE beyond the school day.
- Staff will have access to training opportunities and continued professional development.

Key achievements to date:

- Our school offers after school clubs.
- We take part in competitions outside of school.
- We have CPD for different areas to support teaching.
- We have a clear and progressive curriculum in place.
- We have been awarded the Gold Sports Mark.

How will we check its impact each year?

- The subject co-ordinator and SLT will be monitoring the impact of funding of our school self-evaluation cycle.
- Independent evaluation of our plans will be undertaken by our school improvement partner.
- Carry out lesson observations.

- Link with Stride Active for CPD, communication and access to School Games competitions
- Link with High School (Tenbury), county and Luctonians to provide competitive sporting activities
